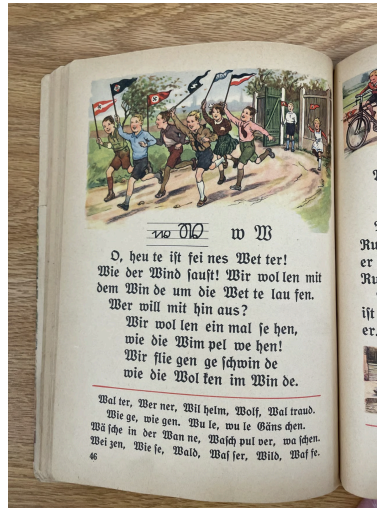
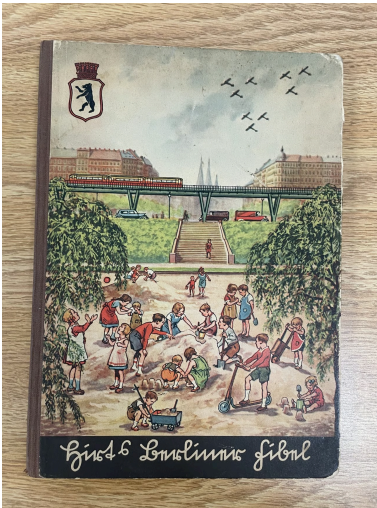


The Museum is proud to present ***Triumph of the Spirit: Jewish Athletes Before, During, and After the Holocaust***, a traveling pop-up exhibit that celebrates the power of sport and the resilience of Jewish athletes in the face of unimaginable adversity. Developed by JCC Chicago's Growing Hope initiative and featuring reproductions of rare memorabilia from the collection of Neil Keller, this exhibit tells the stories of Jewish athletes whose achievements - before, during, and after the Holocaust - served as acts of defiance, perseverance, and pride. From world-class Olympians to local sports heroes, This special exhibit is free with Museum admission and will be on



display in the Museum lobby from July 23 through September 14, 2025.

Artifact Feature



This primary school reading and writing primer, published in 1935, demonstrates how widespread the use of Nazi propaganda was during their years in power. Everyday scenarios are presented to young school children alongside images that normalize Nazi symbols.
