


May 8, 2025, marked eighty years since Germany's surrender in World War II.
Many St. Louisans were involved in military service during the war, and their experiences are preserved in our Collections. Richard E.
Baron was a corporal in the United States Army, serving in the 44th Infantry and 156th Field Artillery Regiment in Europe.

The badges and insignias on his uniform jacket tell the details of his service record, but the inscription on the reverse of the photograph of him and two fellow soldiers give a glimpse into his personality: "the cute one in the middle is me."
