


Now on Display! Visit the St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum to see The American Album, a remarkable new addition to our collection. This one-of-a-kind artifact, loaned by Holocaust survivor Agnes Hirschi Grauz, stepdaughter of Holocaust hero Carl Lutz, includes never-before-seen photographs, letters, and memorabilia documenting his extraordinary life.

Lutz, credited with saving tens of thousands during the Holocaust, spent nearly a decade in the St. Louis area before his heroic efforts in Budapest. Discover this powerful connection to history, now featured in a special pop-up exhibition in our lobby.
